THEN SINGS MY SOUL: FINDING COMFORT AND JOY IN MUSIC ON DEATH ROW... AND AT THE BIG PEACH CAR WASH

I just wanted you to comfort me
When I called you late last night, you see...
Oh, of all the words you sang to me
About life, the truth and being free
Yeah, you sang to me, oh, how you sang to me...

Every Sunday I attend church with one of the men on Georgia's death row. In my imagination we are sitting next to one another in a beautiful sanctuary, making a joyful noise unto God with the help of a powerful organ. In reality, we are on a monitored 20-minute phone call, through a prison vendor called Securus, and my friend on death row is offering a prayer for our troubled world, followed by as many as ten hymns, sung *a cappella*, such as "How Great Thou Art"

(my favorite), "It Is Well With My Soul," "Blessed Assurance," "When the Roll Is Called Up Yonder" and "That Old Rugged Cross" (his favorite). The words of these old hymns that we both sang while growing up in our respective churches take on new meaning during these church sessions on a prison phone, and I am filled with the comfort and joy of God's

presence that the songs promise. On a recent Sunday, I was taking the ministry's minivan through the Big Peach Car Wash in Jackson when the church call came from my friend on death row. We laughed about the odd location to hold church, and decided to proceed anyway as the minivan moved through the swooshing, soapy brushes in the neon-infused tunnel of the automatic car wash. I am a frequent customer at that car wash because I want the minivan to sparkle when I give rides to our death row families, but now when I am there I get much more than a clean car and a peach-scented air freshener – the cleansing waters



also flood my day with a beautiful memory of a man on death row reminding me through prayers and hymns that God's "Amazing Grace" is everywhere.

As part of my ministry at New Hope House, I serve on the board of directors of Georgians For Alternatives to the Death Penalty (GFADP) in an effort to serve those impacted by the death penalty in Georgia while simultaneously working to dismantle the system that oppresses them. For GFADP's annual *Mary Ruth Weir BBQ & Awards Celebration*, named for one of the beloved founders of New Hope House, I created a playlist* of songs that were suggested by the men on Georgia's death row and their families, as well as by activists working to end the death penalty in Georgia. I had the best time gathering the songs from my friends on death row and their families, through conversations that inspired deep reflections on which songs would best represent them. I told them that they could submit anything they wanted... something inspirational, something meaningful, a call to action, or perhaps just something fun. The result was a group of songs that expressed joy, sadness, love, light, loss, hope, longing, anger, revolution, and the desire to be free in every sense of the word. As I listen to the playlist while driving around Georgia, I think of my friends who suggested the songs, and I feel closer to them, and to the best parts of who they are. One of the guys on death row submitted "Dante's Prayer" by Loreena McKennitt, and these lyrics always make me stop to follow their instructions: "When the dark night seems endless / Please remember me." And through remembering I access the comfort and joy I need to keep driving.


Below: Sharing a delicious meal at Fresh Air BBQ or chilling out with popcorn and a movie are just two ways we unwind with our death row families after visitation.
